From the Garden State Parkway (South): Exit 137 (Roselle Park, Cranford), turn right onto North Ave./Route 28 (Westfield Ave.). Proceed west to Springfield Ave. and turn right. The College is 3/4 of a mile on the left.

From Route 22 (East or West): Exit at Springfield Ave. and proceed east towards Westfield. Pass through four traffic lights. Just before the fifth traffic light, turn right onto Springfield Ave. (County Road 615). Proceed to the traffic light, where the College is on the right.

Parking: From Springfield Ave., turn onto Princeton Rd. Parking will be available in Faculty and Staff Lot #4 on Princeton Rd. Enter the lot via the first driveway on the left. Please enter building through the glass doors at the far end of the lot.

Conference Overview

When a loved one is diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease or other form of dementia, it can be life-changing for the entire family. Alzheimer's disease impacts over 500,000 New Jersey residents. According to a recent telephone survey conducted by Fairleigh Dickinson University's PublicMind on behalf of Alzheimer's New Jersey, nearly two-thirds - or more than 68 percent - of New Jersey residents know someone who has or had Alzheimer's or dementia. The survey revealed that Alzheimer's strikes close to home. For those respondents who knew someone who has or had the disease, 71 percent were family members.

Over time, individuals diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease will need increasing support with all aspects of daily life, and family members often assume those responsibilities. Family caregivers often find that they have more questions than answers and may not know what their next steps should be. Becoming educated about Alzheimer's disease, planning ahead, and using local caregiving resources are important strategies for families.



This free half-day conference for family caregivers will:

- Provide a thorough overview of Alzheimer's disease with a focus on care and treatment options, and offer the opportunity to ask questions of the presenting physician.
- Address the importance of legal and financial planning for people with Alzheimer's disease and their families, and provide the opportunity to ask questions of the presenting attorney.
- Promote access to key community agencies through the many resource tables at the event.
