Origin

Established in 1985, Alzheimer's New Jersey was an affiliate of the national Alzheimer's Association, called the Alzheimer's Association Greater New Jersey Chapter. At the end of 2015, the local organization disaffiliated from the national group and changed its name to Alzheimer's New Jersey in response to a vote by the national organization to end its existing affiliation agreements with all local independent chapters across the country, and merge them into one nationwide non-profit organization with national, not local, governance.



Goals

Alzheimer's New Jersey has been providing trusted service to New Jersey families for over 30 years. As we grow, our priority is on new community partnerships and a focus on unmet needs. We are in the final stages of planning Walk to Fight Alzheimer's, our largest fundraising event, scheduled this September and October.
